EMBLEM



6 Logistics Readiness Squadron emblem: on an Ultramarine Azure disc, an Or key and lightning bolt are centered salterwise at the fess point. An Ultramarine globe highlighted with Or longitude and latitude lines is surmounted over the key and lightning bolt, also at the fess point. The disc is

bordered with Sable. An Or scroll is attached above and below the disc. The scrolls are bordered also with Sable. The scroll above is lettered with Sable and bears the unit's motto, "WORLD CLASS SUPPORT." The one below is inscribed 6 LOGISTICS READINESS SQUADRON." Ultramarine Blue and Air Force Yellow are used in the design. Blue represents the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The lightning bolt portrays the speed of our reaction. The global reach of our Supply Support worldwide is represented by the grid. The key signifies the traditional storekeeping nature of the Supply complex. (Approved, 6 Dec 1995)
