On a shield argent, a compass rose gules between two falcon heads, erased in fess, sable, eyes and beaks outlined or, one to the dexter, one to the sinister; on a chief of the second, ten bolts of lightning radiating or; a point in base envecked azure. (Approved, 21 Jun 1957)
