9 Medical Group emblem: Per pale Vert and Sable, a pallet wavy Argent, fimbriated Or, overall on a fess of the last, four crosses pattée of the second, shadowed Brunn, all within a diminished bordure of the third. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "9 MEDICAL GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The background colors represent the old colors of the Air Service parted by an area representing the Rio Grande River. The four crosses represent four WWI offensives--Aisne-Marne, Champagne-Marne, Meuse-Argonne and St. Mihiel--in which squadrons later assigned to the 9 Reconnaissance Wing fought.
