### **EMBLEM**

On an Air Force golden yellow disc edged Air Force blue, bomb in pale pointing downward, silhouetted Air Force blue, supported by two hands erased, one on either side, natural flesh tones, vested gray-green. **SIGNIFICANCE.** The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission of munitions maintenance. It indicates the personal care and attention to technical details given to all munitions handled and processed by the organization. The emblem displays the Air Force colors, ultramarine blue and golden yellow, and the squadron's color, gray-green. (Approved, 5 Jul 1962)
