55 Avionics Maintenance Squadron emblem: On a blue disc edged with a narrow yellow border, two white cloud formations fesswise, one issuing from sinister in the top of the disc beside a yellow and black electron winged fessurise white with black details and the other issuing from dexter in base beside a red wyvern regardant, detailed black. Attached below the disc a white scroll edged yellow. The gold border around the blue background indicates that the unit is a part of the United States Air Force. The blue background and the white clouds on it are symbolic of the sky in a peaceful state, which the unit's mission supports. The red wyvern, shown regardant, symbolizes the hostile forces in the world, which are attentive to the airpower supported by the unit. The white-winged gold electron indicates the unit's mission of providing airborne electronic equipment. (Approved, 21 July 1977
