During this period, there were also organizational changes among several squadrons that did not fly or maintain aircraft. First, on 8 March 1967, the 60th Air Police Squadron was redesignated the 60th Security Police Squadron. This change represented the third redesignation of the base police

organization in less than a decade. Originally, during World War II, this unit had been known as the Provost Marshall's Office. Later, it was called the Military Police Squadron. The new name, the 60th Security Police Squadron, more accurately reflected its law enforcement and base security functions.
