OPERATIONS

A new reserve unit was activated and assigned to the 945 Military Airlift Group (Reserve). The new unit was designated the 66 Aeromedical Evaluation Flight staffed by some 30 flight nurses

and medical technicians from the 32 Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron stationed at the Freeport Center in Clearfield. The 32 was disbanded., 1 Dec 1966

Inactivated at Hill AFB, Utah was the 66 Aeromedical Evaluation Flight assigned to the Western AFRR. Personnel were reassigned as directed. Strength was 15 officers (13 authorized Flight Nurses), and 20 airmen. 31 JAN 1973

1 July 1972, the 66th Aeromedical Evacuation Flight was reassigned from the 945th Military Airlift Group to the Western Air Force Reserve Region (AFRR). It was later inactivated on 31 January 1973. Another tenant, the 449th Medical Service Flight of the Western AFRR was also inactivated effective 3 January 1973
