EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, in front of a scroll turned twice, swallow-tailed at both ends in bend sinister Gules, a caduceus, wings and pole Or, detailed Sable snakes Vert, surmounted by a tooth Argent, detailed of the fourth, all within a diminished bordure Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "86TH DENTAL SQUADRON" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "PLURES JUNCTA IN UNO" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red scroll symbolizes valor. The caduceus signifies the neutrality of the medical field during war. The white tooth represents the wisdom and perfection strived for by the unit. (Approved, 18 Apr 2001)
