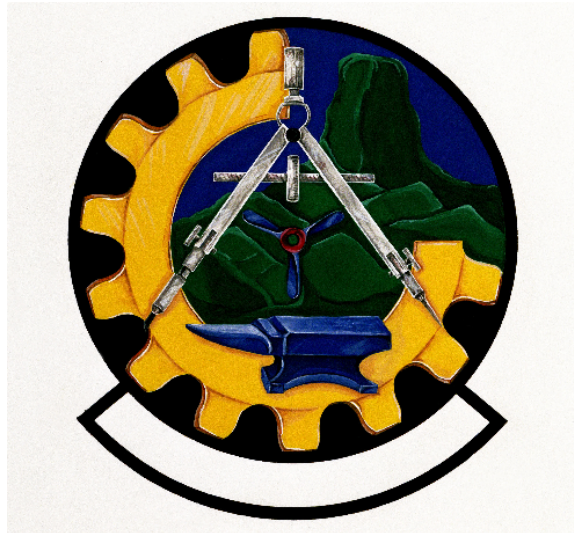

EMBLEM

Blue and Yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The butte rising from the plain suggests the location of the unit. The demi-gear suggests the foundation of excellence established by the squadron and its continuous effort to accomplish the unit mission. The anvil represents the history of the unit's home base as a cavalry post and the ideas of the past which provide the tools of today to accomplish the goals of tomorrow. The propeller reflects the squadron's history of support to the 90 Bombardment Group. The compass represents the tools of civil engineering.
