EMBLEM

On a disc Azure and Sable, in base a terrestrial globe Gris, landmasses Argent, emitting a bendwise lightning flash Gules, terminating in a delta of the third, in sinister chief a stylized satellite of the fourth; all within a narrow Yellow border. Above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "GATEWAY TO THE HIGH FRONTIER" in Yellow letters. Below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "ADVANCED SPACE OPS SCHOOL" in Yellow letters. Ultramarine Blue and Air Force Yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue represents the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The elements within the patch represent the disciplines taught at the school. The satellite represents satellite operations; the flash represents space command and control systems and missile warning systems reaching out into space. The Delta at the end of the bolt signifies launch, both spacelift and ICBM. The communications bolt divides the patch in half representing night and day, denoting 24-hour vigilance. The motto is taken directly from the heritage unit, the 319th Space Training Squadron, "GATEWAY TO THE HIGH FRONTIER." (Approved, 30 Jul 1988)
