EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, above a winged torch Or, detailed Gold Brown, flamed Gules, three lightning flashes, one bendwise in dexter, one palewise in chief and one bend sinisterwise in sinister, points up of the last, splitting four mullets arched in chief, two and two, Argent, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "COMMUNICATE DOMINATE" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "AETC COMPUTER SYSTEMS SQ" in Yellow letters.

EMBLEM SIGNIFICANCE

Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The lightning flashes represent the unit's domination of communications in the command. The torch symbolizes the unit's support of education and training. The stars signify the unit's readiness. No matter the situation, the Squadron lives up to its motto, "COMMUNICATE DOMINATE."
