# **OPERATIONS**

Constituted in the Organized Reserve 15 October 1921 as the 31st Airdrome Company, assigned to the General Headquarters Reserve, and allotted to the Second Corps Area. Initiated 10 December 1921 at New Dorp, S.I., NY. Redesignated on the 419th Airdrome Company 25 January 1923. Redesignated on 419th Airdrome Squadron 1 October 1933. Inactivated about July 1935 at New Dorp by relief of personnel. Consolidated on 25 November 1936 with the 419th Aero Squadron (Construction) (a WWI unit organized in March 1918 at Vancouver Barracks, WA; redesignated as the 43rd Spruce Squadron July 1918; demobilized in January 1919 at Vancouver Barracks; reconstituted on 25 November 1936). Designated mobilization training station was Mitchel Field, NY. Disbanded 31 May 42.
