EMBLEM

On a disc Celeste, a cross coupé Gules, surmounted by a globe Azure, gridlined Argent, charged with a mullet emitting a gyron arrondi of the like, terminating at nombril point in a caduceus of the first detailed of the third, all within a narrow border Blue. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "COUNT ON US FOR CARE" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "514TH AEROMEDICAL STAGING SQ" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red cross is a symbol of medical care. The globe indicates the scope of the unit's mission. The star and contrail signifies the quick response ability of the unit. The caduceus in this case shows the specialized nature of medicine in the aviation environment.
