60 Aerospace Medicine Squadron optimizes human performance and health by providing the highest quality clinical care, performance enhancement, preventive health service, and environmental risk assessments for more than 2,000 flyers, their families and more than 4,500 workers in 122 industrial centers. It also protects food and water safety for more than 23,000 base personnel, serves USTRANSCOM with an Aeromedical Staging Facility that provides 24/7/365 care for wounded warriors and operates the largest hyperbaric treatment chamber in the Department of Defense.

With 114 authorized personnel supporting a \$310.5 million total annual medical expense, 60 AMDS ensures expeditionary forces are medically ready and postured for worldwide operations.
