OPERATIONS

Organized as the 66th Army Air Forces Base Unit (Weather Technician Unit) at Asheville, NC, and assigned to the Army Air Forces Weather Wing on 7 September 1944. It moved to Harvard University, Cambridge, MA, 11 October 1944, and to Seymour Johnson Field, NC, and was redesignated as the 66th Army Air Forces Base Unit (Weather Qualification and Service Group), 1 May 1945. It was redesignated as the 66th Army Air Forces Base Unit (Redeployment and Training Unit), 26 May 1945. It was assigned to the Headquarters, Continental Weather Wing on 15 November 1945 and moved to Tinker Field, OK, on 21 January 1946. It was discontinued on 10 May 1948.
