67th AIR FORCE BASE UNIT (HEADQUARTERS CONTINENTAL WEATHER WING)

Designated the 67th Army Air Forces Base Unit (Headquarters Continental Weather Wing),

organized at Asheville, North Carolina, and assigned to the Army Air Forces Weather Service on 1 October 1945. It moved to Tinker Field, Oklahoma, on 16 November 1945 and was redesignated the 67th Air Force Base Unit (Headquarters Continental Weather Wing) on 26 September 1947. The 68th AAFBU (101st Weather Group), 70th AAFBU (103d Weather Group), 71st AAFBU (104th Weather Group), and the 74th AAFBU (102d Weather Group) were assigned to it. The 67th was discontinued on 3 June 1948 when its personnel were transferred to the 59th Weather Wing [MAJCON]
