## EMBLEM



On a disc Celeste, a silhouette of an aircraft Sable, nose upwards bearing a rod Argent winged Or, the rod interlaced by two serpents respectant Gules, on a point removed of the second, bendy sinister demi of six and bendy demi of six, below four dashes palewise, all of the third, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed “78TH AEROSPACE MEDICINE SQ” in Yellow letters. **SIGIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The elements of the emblem combined represent sustained excellence in healthcare by promoting safe mission execution on the flight line, in the clinic, in industry and across the globe. The unit’s mission is to deliver exceptional healthcare and occupational support to warfighters, beneficiaries and the industrial workforce through prevention, protection and risk mitigation.
